**Key study questions or service delivery strategy**

1. To assess program sustainability by evaluating how key Cervical Cancer Prevention Program (CECAP) indicators change over time, as funding from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation is withdrawn and replaced by local or other funding sources.
2. To determine how key quality assurance approaches implemented by CECAP in Thailand are being applied to maintain the quality of services.
3. To establish the extent to which providers maintain competence achieved during the initial training course.
